Transition Workshop for Parents of Grade 5 and 6 students Thursday November 3rd from 6-7pm

On Thursday November 3rd, our senior students (5 & 6) will work with visiting presenter Kritz throughout the day and in the evening, we're running a parent session to explore the year 6-7 transition process. This will be our final parent session in the series we've offered this year. How can you best support your child/ren as they navigate the change from SPS to the secondary school setting?

This is a great opportunity for parents, grandparents and carers to come along for an informative evening. Secondary schools are reporting the noticeable social and interpersonal impact of our covid disruptions on incoming students, so how can we support them all. Working with Kritz will provide an opportunity to hear from an expert in the field.
